11:05 - 12:05 Exhibition: 'Germany's Confrontation with the Holocaust in a Global Context' - Exhibition led by Professor Stuart Taberner from the University of Leeds

In this session, we will do a guided tour of the Exhibition 'Germany's Confrontation with the Holocaust in a Global Context', developed by the German Department at the University of Leeds, and then debate some of the questions that the exhibition raises. For example: What meaning does the Holocaust have for Germans today, seventy years after the end of the war? How does reconciliation happen? What kinds of memorials are most appropriate for the Holocaust? What does the Holocaust mean to us, and how and why do we remember it? The session will be conducted as a question and answer session, building on pupils' responses to viewing the exhibition.—in English

12:45 - 1:45 A CHOICE between ...

a) A workshop on Der Vorleser - Professor Stuart Taberner from the University of Leeds

In this session, we will examine one of the best-known German books of recent years: Bernhard Schlink's Der Vorleser. (The novel also features in the exhibition 'Germany's Confrontation with the Holocaust in a Global Context'). We will start with some plot summary, taking account of the fact that not everyone will have read all the book, or even know the book at all! Then, we will discuss some of the novel's key themes: love, sex, responsibility, victimhood, whether we should forgive or condemn Hanna for her role as a concentration camp guard, and the role of the ambivalent narrator, Michael.— in English

- b) A workshop on Der Besuch der alten Dame :- an interactive analysis on how its emerging themes provide an opportunity for discussing deeper questions on the Contemporary Social Issue Topic of Wealth and Poverty, deeply embedded, of course, in the notion of morals and ethics. Rute Bonnell in German
- 1:45—2:45 Workshop: an analysis of GERMAN RE-UNIFICATION, using Goodbye Lenin and Das Leben der Anderen as springboards for planned wider questions on the Contemporary Social and Political Issue Topic of Law and Order, as highlighted by the umbrella topic of German Re-unification. Bertram Richter mainly in English/partly in German
- 2:45 3:30 A CHOICE between ... (teachers of incoming schools to divide their groups between the 2 sessions)
- a) Workshop: EXTENDED SPEAKING OPPORTUNITIES An opportunity for students to tackle exam style questions, putting into practice advice and techniques put forward on the day— Bertram Richter in German
